Previous Minutes:

Minutes of previous AGM held 18th November 2018 – Voted as true and correct by those present.

Chairman's report - Jim Turner:

Jim welcomed everyone and provided a brief report on the 24th year of the Fatboy's club.

Generally a smooth running year with strong member turnout albeit seasonal.

Social media and event organization has seen an increased use of Viber and Team App communication. Use of the website has reduced significantly and emails are generally only used for advertising major events such as the Hawaiian Shirt Ride and the Christmas function.

Post Sunday ride coffee remains at Koffee Ink. The situation with the reopening of "Arnies" remains up in the air.

Jim reminded members that the group is aging and support of individuals should remain a priority within the club.

Finances - Bill Dartnell:

Current bank account stands at \$10,100 down \$1,700 on last year.

The Willunga Hill Tour Down Under BBQ raised \$1400 and the Hawaiian shirt ride raised \$1387 plus a further \$450 from general Club funds donated to the Adelaide Day Centre.

There is \$1,300 of older uniform stock available for purchase.

Rides Report - Matt Ferris:

The number and types of club rides has expanded further this year. Off road riding, either mountain bike or gravel, have joined the regular rides. A large number of Errol's "Cruiser's" took part in the inaugural 200km in April and a repeat is planned for April next year.

The usual annual rides went ahead again this year. Graham's Ride to the Greenman Inn at Ashbourne returned after a year in hiatus and the Normanville excursion (approx. 200km), the Tour de Fleurieu (300km) and the Hawaiian Shirt Ride all went well.

The 10 day trip along the length of the Munda Biddi Trail in South West of WA (Albany to Perth) April was also a great success.

Members were reminded that the first Sunday of the month is the 'Club Ride', all are encouraged to attend and no other rides are to be scheduled on that day.
